



“Opened by Grace to pray to the Lord of the harvest ...” ~Matthew 9:38

Week 1

*We don't have to pray for God to begin a movement for Jesus Christ through us.
If we are following after Jesus Christ, then we are already a part of a movement.
We need to pray then for God to help us follow after Jesus Christ.*

Read Matthew 4:18-22

Sunday – Jesus, thank you for calling me to follow you. It is a gift and an honor.

Monday – Almighty God, give me the strength I need to follow after your Son Jesus.

Tuesday – Lord of Church, thank you that I am a part of the movement your resurrection began. Use my life to extend and expand that movement to more and more people and to more and more places.

Wednesday – Holy Spirit, keep me from those things that would hinder or prevent my being a part of your move around the world. Help me to walk more and more in step with Jesus.

Thursday – Sending Jesus, raise up more and more for your harvest who can be a part of your Kingdom coming and your will being done. Thank you for making me one of those workers.

Friday – Lord God, thank you for all the workers you are raising up already. Give those workers the relationships and the resources and the encouragement they need.

Saturday – Father, thank you for hearing and answering our prayers. Shape us to be more and more like your Son Jesus as we follow after Him.



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Week 2

Here is the thought for this week:

*Our call is to be followers, even more than it is to be innovators.
Maybe the most “innovative” thing we could do would be to follow Jesus more closely.*

Read Matthew 4:19

Sunday – Father, just as Jesus’ food was to do your will and accomplish what you had sent Him to do, may your will and following you also be our food and nourishment (John 4:34).

Monday – Faithful Jesus, just as you only did what you saw your Father doing, may we also be those who only do what we see you doing (John 5:19).

Tuesday – Master Jesus, just as you only spoke what you heard your Father saying, may we also be those who only speak what we hear you saying (John 8:28).

Wednesday – Calling Jesus, just as you served and gave us an example to follow so that we would know what to do, may we discover the blessing of doing and following the example of what you have shown us to do (John 13:15,17).

Thursday – Holy Spirit, help us to follow Jesus to the point of denying ourselves and taking up our crosses (Mark 8:34). We cannot do this in our own power. We need you!

Friday – Kingdom Father, may we seek you and the Kingdom first, and may all that we do follow from that (Matthew 6:33).

Saturday – Our Sending God, may we follow your Son Jesus in making disciples, and may we follow Jesus in raising up disciple-makers. Multiply workers for your harvest who are intent on following after you and your Son Jesus (Matthew 28:19-20).



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Week 3

Here is the thought for the week:

A disparity between what we need and what we have leads to a sense of desperation, and desperation leads to a recognition of our total dependency on God, which leads us to cry out to heaven.

The key to bringing in the harvest, according to Jesus, is workers who are raised up as a result of prayer (Matthew 9:38). The reaching of more people and the planting of more churches, according to Jesus, is a worker issue. Jesus gives us a description of the harvest. It is plentiful. And then He gives us a prescription. That is prayer. All Jesus tells us to do is pray. The reason? The need is for workers to be sent out into the harvest, and God is the one who can raise up the workers. We are not in the creation business. Only God is. We can develop workers once they are raised up, but we cannot create them. Only God can.

Take some time to read and then pray about Exodus 16:1-35.

Sunday – Ask God to make us as hungry for HIS work of raising up workers for the harvest as Israel was hungry for food from heaven. As long as we think the work of raising up workers for the harvest is our work, we are going to be limiting the work God wants to do through us!

Monday – Ask God to help us become comfortable with, and in fact, for it to be preferable that we live with, a total sense of desperation and dependency on God for the workers (manna from heaven) that are needed for the vast harvest around us.

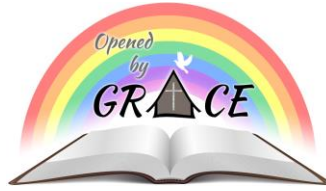
Tuesday – Ask God to help us see and gather the workers (manna from heaven) that He has already given us and who are already laboring alongside of us.

Wednesday – Ask God to help us call others together to pray for the harvest and to pray for God to raise up workers for the harvest. May our network of prayer partners multiply!

Thursday – Ask God to help us to be faithful with the workers (manna from heaven) He provides, and to follow His instructions and leadership in the development of them.

Friday – Ask God to raise up more workers than our current system can contain, so that our container is burst and we therefore have to rethink how we do what we do so that we no longer keep using such limiting containers and systems.

Saturday – Ask God to make us His own “manna from heaven,” bread in the hands of the Savior, blessed and willing to be broken, like the loaves in Jesus’ hands in Mark 6, ready to be offered to the world on His behalf.



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Week 4

Here is the thought for this week:

We will have some part in "bearing fruit" only when our whole part is "remaining in Christ".

Read John 15:4-5 (NIV)

Sunday – Vine Jesus, thank you for your grace which has made me a branch that is fully connected to you! I praise you Jesus!

Monday – Father Gardener, thank you for pruning me, even though painful, so that I can be even more fruitful. Continue to prune and shape me for your Kingdom purposes.

Tuesday – Savior Jesus, forgive me for when I have hindered or cut off my connection to you through disobedience. Restore me to you, and bear in me the fruits of love and obedience to you and your Word.

Wednesday – Holy Spirit, help me to acknowledge and always believe the words, "Apart from me you can do nothing." May I live fully dependent on your power, and raise up workers for the harvest that fully depend on you.

Thursday – Thank you for the promise, Father, that when we remain in you and your words remain in us, that what we ask will be given to us. And so we pray your words, "Send out workers into your harvest field."

Friday – Eternal Jesus, may the fruit that you bear through my life as a result of remaining in you, be fruit that will last, and be fruit that will have an eternal impact.

Saturday – Lord Jesus, may my fruit bearing always be to your Father's glory, showing myself to be your disciple. Multiply workers for your harvest that also bear fruit to your Father's glory.



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Week 5

Here is the thought for this week:

We should not try to do alone what God created us to do together!

Read Ephesians 4:15-16

Sunday – Thank you Father, for creating us for relationship with you and for relationship with one another. Help us to live consistent with who you have created us to be.

Monday – Thank you Jesus, for recreating us into your Body, the Church. Help us to live consistent with who you have recreated us to be, and forgive us for when we have not lived as one Body.

Tuesday – Giving Jesus, as your Body, teach us how to celebrate one another and how you have gifted each one of us, instead of comparing ourselves to one another.

Wednesday – Holy Spirit, as the Body of Christ, help us to cooperate with one another in your Kingdom work, instead of competing with one another.

Thursday – Generous Father, as the Body of your Son Jesus, help us to be far better at encouraging one another, instead of being better at criticizing one another.

Friday – Eternal Jesus, as your living Body, help us to trust one another and the Holy Spirit who is living within us, instead of controlling and distrusting one another.

Saturday – Powerful Spirit, multiply workers for your harvest who believe that they have been created for community and for working together with one another, for the sake of the Kingdom mission, and for the glory of the Father. Teach me how to be one of those workers.



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Week 6

Here is the thought for this week:

The quality of our relationship with God and the quality of our relationships with one another as believers are directly related to our ability to lead others into a relationship with God.

Read John 17:20-26, especially verse 25

Sunday – Savior Jesus, may your prayer be answered in us. May it be answered in and through me.

Monday – Father, thank you for sending your Son to make us one with you. Now help us to be one with one another as your followers.

Tuesday – Lord Jesus, raise up workers for your harvest who seek the kind of oneness and unity for which you prayed, and for which you died.

Wednesday – Holy Spirit, make us, as your followers, a reflection of you, a picture of reconciliation for the world, and an instrument of redemption on behalf of those who do not know you.

Thursday – Lord Jesus, the number of people in the United States without a relationship with you is growing faster than the number of people who are coming into a relationship with you. Unite us in our mission, and raise up more workers so that we are able to reach more people in this vast mission field.

Friday – Father, “...all nations” no longer refers only to other parts of the world. “All nations” describes the cities of this nation. May we be willing to be a Church for all nations, right in our back yards, as well as around the world.

Saturday – Jesus, help us to be faithful in praying to you to raise up more workers for the harvest. It’s the only thing you told us to do in order to see more workers raised!



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Week 7

Here is the thought for this week:

As we know our communities we are able to love our communities, and as we love our communities we are able to reach our communities.

Read Matthew 9:35-38

Sunday – Lord Jesus, you went, and because you went, you saw. Help us to go and see.

Monday – Lord Jesus, because you went, you saw, and because you saw, you knew what people were going through, that they were “harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.” Help us to see so that we can know.

Tuesday – Lord Jesus, because you saw, you knew, and because you knew, you cared and felt compassion. Help us to go and see and know so that we will care and will feel compassion like you feel.

Wednesday – Lord Jesus, because you knew, you cared and felt, and because you cared, you served and taught and brought healing to many. Help us to feel so that we act and care and teach and serve others.

Thursday – Lord Jesus, because you cared, you served and taught and healed, and because you loved and served and people heard, people believed. Help us care and serve and teach people so that many more will believe in you.

Friday – Lord Jesus, because you cared and taught, people believed, and so that more people would believe, you called us to pray for more workers for the harvest who would go and see and know and care and serve and teach. Help us Pray.

Saturday – Lord Jesus, you once said that your food was to do the will of your Father. Living your mission tired you, but it did not drain you. Help us to believe that going in your name, getting to know those who need to know your name, showing love to others in the power of your name, and sowing your Word so that people will call on your name, is our mission, and that we will be energized for our work as we faithfully follow you.



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Week 8

Here is the thought for this week:

You will always be able to do your best at whatever you are best at doing. So do your best at whatever you do best!

Read Ephesians 4:11-16

Sunday – Creator God, your Word says that we are fearfully and wonderfully made. Thank you for making me the way that I am and for giving me the gifts that I have. May I always use them for your Kingdom purposes and for your glory.

Monday – Giving Jesus, thank you for using all that the Father had given you, to accomplish for us what we could not do for ourselves. We thank and praise you.

Tuesday – Spirit of Unity, forgive us for when we have compared ourselves to one another or competed with one another or criticized one another over the gifts you have given us. Help us to celebrate who you have made us to be, and to celebrate who you have made others to be.

Wednesday – Kingdom Father, keep us from neglecting to use all of the gifts you have given your Body, the Church. We celebrate that you have given your Church apostles, prophets, teachers, evangelists, and pastors. Raise up more workers for the harvest who have those gifts so that your Body may be complete.

Thursday – Lord Jesus, may I yield to you for how you have chosen to give out your gifts, and may I focus only on using the gifts you have given me. Help me to know and recognize those gifts and those things that I can do best.

Friday – Father, raise up workers for your harvest who are able recognize and utilize the gifts you have given your people. Thank you Father.

Saturday – Holy Spirit, keep us from ever thinking more highly of ourselves than we ought, but also, help us to always think of ourselves as highly as you do!



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Week 9

Here is the thought for the week:

We reproduce what we are, and multiply what we model.

Read John 13:15, 1 Corinthians 11:1, Philippians 3:17

Sunday – Father God, as we pray for harvest workers for your Kingdom, let us who pray consider ourselves and what kind of harvest workers that we are. Help us to be those who could and should invite others to follow our example!

Monday – Lord Jesus, forgive us for being less than what you meant for us to be, and for not modeling what we have been asking you to multiply. We praise you for your grace.

Tuesday – Holy Spirit, your Word is power. Let that Word of power be displayed in our lives and help us to embody what it teaches!

Wednesday – Lord God, we seek your mercy for when we have attempted to lead merely with our words instead of with our lives! Thank you for your patient love.

Thursday – Lord Jesus, in order to help release a movement of Kingdom harvest workers, make me someone you would want to reproduce and help me model someone you would want to multiply.

Friday – Holy Spirit, thank you that our weaknesses and limitations do not limit you. We boldly ask you to raise up more harvest workers from every place and in every way, and to especially raise up workers from the harvest of those who are right now being reached with your Gospel!

Saturday – Father, thank you that through your Son Jesus, you told us what we needed to do to see you raise up more workers. And so, our Father, continue to teach us to pray!



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Week 10

Here is the thought for this week:

*Our “adoption as God’s children” are not an entitlement.
They are an entrustment.*

Read Romans 6:3-4, Matthew 20:25-28, 2 Corinthians 3:4-6

Sunday – Jesus, teach me how to serve and give my life for you, the One who gave your life as a ransom for many.

Monday – Jesus, forgive me for when I have wanted to be the “first” in your Kingdom instead of the “last, and the “greatest” in your Kingdom instead of the “least.” Thank you for your amazing grace.

Tuesday – Jesus, thank you for calling me and placing a burden on my heart for your Kingdom. There is nothing I have done to have deserved the honor of serving you. Help me to never forget that.

Wednesday – Jesus, being called as your child means that all you have has been given to me. It is all gift. May my sense of calling never become a sense of entitlement.

Thursday – Jesus, keep me from “positional leadership” and teach me how to provide spiritual, missional leadership in your Kingdom. Raise up workers who desire to be spiritual and missional leaders.

Friday – Jesus, thank you that you did not consider equality with the Father as something to be grasped, but that you made yourself a servant, humbling yourself, even to the point of death. Help me to be a follower of you.

Saturday – Multiply workers for your harvest who do not feel they are entitled to anything, but who know and celebrate that because of your grace, that are the recipients of everything they need to fulfill their calling!



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Week 11

Here is the thought for this week:

Sometimes it takes a while for visions to become reality, and some visions God gives us may only become reality after we're gone. But if it is a vision from God, it will become a reality someday.

Read Matthew 28:19 “...make disciples of ALL nations...” Then Matthew 24:14

Sunday – Jesus, thank you for casting a vision for us that is as big as your heart and as big as your world, and thank you for including us in that vision.

Monday – Lord Jesus, help us to not feel overwhelmed by the vision and mission you have given us. Instead, may we always remain humbled by the fact that you have asked us to help make your vision a reality.

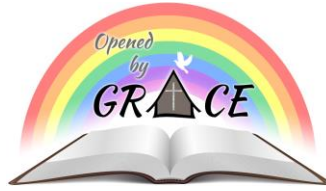
Tuesday – Holy Spirit, make us bold, make us persistent, and make us patient as we participate in fulfilling your vision.

Wednesday – Lord God, fulfilling your vision is not about how much we have in our hands, but about how much we are willing to place in yours. Help us to place ourselves and all that we have even more completely into your hands.

Thursday – Lord Jesus, the size of your vision requires more workers. You said that the “...harvest (vision) is plentiful (huge) but the workers are few. Pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out more workers.” And so we pray, send out more workers!

Friday – Holy Spirit, we not only need more workers, but we need more workers who have a heart for your vision instead of only their own. Raise up more workers with your heart.

Saturday – Father, keep your vision clearly before our eyes, because what we can see, we can pursue and can lead!



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Week 12

Here is the thought for this week:

According to Jesus, the most difficult thing won't be knowing what to do, but rather doing what we already know.

Read Matthew 28:20 “...and teaching them to obey...”

Sunday – May we “Seek first his Kingdom and his righteousness...” Matthew 6:33

Monday – May we “Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.” Luke 10:2

Tuesday – May we “Heal the sick who are there and tell them, the ‘Kingdom of God is near you.’” Luke 10:9

Wednesday – May we respond Jesus when He says, “I have set for you an example that you should do as I have done for you.” John 13:15

Thursday – May we follow Jesus when He says, “As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you.” John 20:21

Friday – May we fulfill Jesus’ words when He says, “Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.” John 13:34

Saturday – May we obey when Jesus says, “Therefore go, and make disciples of all nations...” Matthew 28:19



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Week 13

Here is the thought for this week:

The extent to which unbelievers know that we love them, and the extent to which we are willing to sacrifice for them, will determine, in large part, whether or not we reach them.

Read Luke 19:10

Sunday – Savior Jesus, you came to seek (you took the initiative), and save (you paid the price), the lost. That includes me! Thank you for seeking and finding me and suffering and dying for me that I might know you and be your own.

Monday – Father, you long to have a restored relationship with every person you have created, and are longing for all those who do not yet have their relationship with you restored. Help us to long for them with you, and have hearts that break over them like you do.

Tuesday – Lord Jesus, as your Church incarnates into this world just as you did, help your Church to also demonstrate your love in real and tangible ways in order that your Word might penetrate the hearts of those who do not know you.

Wednesday – Holy Spirit, create in us new hearts that are willing to love the unlovable and extend to the seemingly unreachable.

Thursday – Lord Jesus, the number of people in the United States without a relationship with you is growing faster than the number of people who are coming into a relationship with you. Raise up more workers so that we are able to reach more people in this vast mission field.

Friday – Father, “...all nations” no longer refers only to other parts of the world. “All nations” describes the cities of this nation. May we be willing to be a Church for all nations, right in our back yards, as well as around the world.

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Week 14

Here is the thought for this week:

We need to be willing to step into the “messy” of people’s lives, because it is in the messy that we find an entre for the Gospel.

Read Luke 4:18-19, Luke 5:12-16 for examples

Sunday – Giving Jesus, people with everything to gain and nothing to lose are very receptive to the Gospel. Help us to be with those who are ready to receive you.

Monday – Healing Jesus, when people’s relationships are not working, usually their lives are not working very well either. Help us to be able to speak into the lives of those with broken and hurting relationships.

Tuesday – Restoring Jesus, you stepped into the lives of the broken, the sinful, the sick, and the outcast and restored and transformed their lives. Help us to be willing to do the same.

Wednesday – Liberating Jesus, people in “prison” and bondage need to be set free. Help us to bring the keys of your liberating Gospel to those being held captive.

Thursday – Creating Jesus, raise up workers for your harvest who have your heart and passion for those who need you and are ready to embrace and follow you.

Friday – Compassionate Jesus, thank you for loving us, even though our lives are broken and messy. Help us to see our sin more clearly, so that we can experience your grace more fully.

Saturday – Sending Jesus, send out workers into your harvest field. May I be one of those workers, and may you use my life to multiply many other workers.



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Week 15

Here is the thought for this week:

We reproduce who we are, and multiply what we model.

Read John 13:15, 1 Corinthians 11:1, Philippians 3:17

Sunday – Father God, as we pray for harvest workers for your Kingdom, let us who pray consider ourselves and what kind of harvest workers that we are. Help us to be those who could and should invite others to follow our example!

Monday – Lord Jesus, forgive us for being less than what you meant for us to be, and for not modeling what we have been asking you to multiply. We praise you for your grace.

Tuesday – Holy Spirit, your Word is power. Let that Word of power be displayed in our lives and help us to embody what it teaches!

Wednesday – Lord God, we seek your mercy for when we have attempted to lead merely with our words instead of with our lives! Thank you for your patient love.

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Week 16

Here is the thought for this week:

Even though Peter began to sink as he struggled to walk on water, he was the only one of the twelve who got to feel the hand of Jesus.

See Matthew 14:22-33

Sunday – Father, thank you for calling me into a faith-relationship with you. Believing in you is a lot like walking on water. Help me to walk faithfully.

Monday – Savior Jesus, thank you for calling me to step out in faith and trust you for the impossible. Help me to step out boldly.

Tuesday – Strong Jesus, apart from you, I can do nothing of any eternal significance. Help me to rely on you solely.

Wednesday – Calling Jesus, forgive me for when I have focused on the waves instead of on you. Help me to keep my eyes on you completely.

Thursday – Holy Spirit, multiply water walking workers for your Kingdom. May many more answer your call to “come and join you on the water.

Friday – Kind Jesus, thank you for offering me your hand instead of your condemnation when I doubt and begin to sink. Help me to take your hand joyfully.

Saturday – Our Sending God, raise up more workers who are ready to leave the comfort of the boat for the adventure of the water. Help me to be one of them!



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Week 17

Making new disciples is about introducing people to a Person, even more than about inviting people to a place.

Read John 1:35-46

Sunday – Thank you Jesus for your invitation to be in a relationship with you. Go with me and strengthen me as I introduce others to you so that they can have a relationship with you as well.

Monday – Jesus, you are who I want people to know, even more than me, my friends, or my church. Thank you that they can find you through my church, but I pray even more that people will find you through me as I introduce you to them and them to you.

Tuesday – Gracious Jesus, forgive me for when I have been hesitant, and sometimes even fearful, of just introducing people to you. Help me to overcome what hinders me.

Wednesday – Lord Jesus, reassure me and remind me that I do not need an event or program to invite people to in order for me to introduce them to you. Though these are helpful and good, may I instead invite them into my life and through that connection, introduce them to you.

Thursday – Multiplying Jesus, send out thousands of workers for your harvest across this nation who are committed to planting you, Savior Jesus, wherever they go, and who know how to introduce people to you, the Person.

Friday – Jesus, you are a Person, not a religion. You are a Person, not a place. May I never forget that, and may I not neglect to share that with others.

Saturday – Powerful Savior, you have redeemed and saved me, and are transforming my life. May those always be my reason and motivation to share you with others.



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Week 18

People need a picture to see, not just a sermon to hear.

Read Hebrews 13:6-7

Sunday – Savior Jesus, thank you that you did not merely see a vision of a world reconciled to your Father, but that you embodied that vision with your very life and gave your life for that vision.

Monday – Humble Jesus, thank you that you did not merely speak about the truth, but that you embodied the truth in your very life.

Tuesday – Father God, thank you that you loved the world so much that you were willing to GIVE your help only Son for the salvation of the world, and for my salvation.

Wednesday – Holy Spirit, thank you for the power you give to make the Word come to life in our lives, and thank you that you are shaping our lives to match what the Word says.

Thursday – Powerful Spirit, help me to be someone who does not merely see the vision and then work to get everyone else to live that vision. Help me to be someone who actually embodies that vision with my life.

Friday – Lord God, thank you for all the workers for the harvest that you raise up. Raise up workers who not only speak your Word clearly with their mouths, but also live your Word boldly with their lives.

Saturday – Raising Jesus, just as you were raised from the dead by the power you have, raise up more workers for your harvest by that same power.



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Week 19

*Whatever is sown in faithfulness will grow and bear fruit, for the Father is faithful.
Ours is to remain active in the Father’s work while we wait.*

Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-11, John 4:34-38

Sunday – Father, thank you that the seed of your Word was sown into our hearts and has born the fruit of faith in you. Make us harvest workers who are also sowing your Word into the hearts of others.

Monday – Jesus, help us to be as faithful with sowing as we are motivated to be with harvesting. Remind us that we only harvest where someone else has already sown.

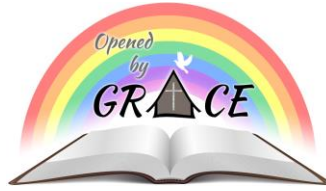
Tuesday – Holy Spirit, help us to sow you and your Word generously. Help us to overcome the fears that would keep us from sharing you and your Word.

Wednesday – Savior Jesus, your food was to the do the will of your Father who had sent you. May we be nourished by that same food, and may you multiply workers for the harvest who are also nourished in the same way.

Thursday – Spirit of God, forgive us for when we only wanted to fill our own barns and churches, instead of joining you in wanting to fill heaven. Purify our motives for farming.

Friday – Lord God, in you alone is the power to make a seed sprout and grow and flourish and bear fruit. Apart from you, we can do nothing. Help us to never forget that.

Saturday – Jesus, raise up a multitude of harvest “farmers” for your Kingdom. May I be one of those farmers.



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Week 20

We have not just been given the responsibility to make disciples. We have also been given the authority to make disciples.

Read Matthew 28:18

Sunday – Jesus, with authority comes permission. Thank you that you have given us all the permission we need to go about making more disciples. Help us to do so with humility.

Monday – Father God, with authority comes purpose. Thank you for making it clear as to why we have been given your authority. Help us to see that purpose with clarity.

Tuesday – Holy Spirit, with authority comes power. Thank you for giving us all the power that we need to fulfill the purpose for which we have been sent. Help us to do our work with confidence.

Wednesday – Savior Jesus, with authority comes presence. Thank you for promising to be with us always. Help us to never feel alone.

Thursday – Spirit of God, with authority comes provision. Thank you for giving everything that we need to accomplish anything you call us to do. Help us to serve with thankfulness.

Friday – Lord God, with authority comes protection. Thank you for covering us with your outstretched hand. Help us to never be afraid.

Saturday – Jesus, with authority comes promise. Thank you for the hope that having your authority gives. Help us to remain certain that you will multiply workers for your harvest.
